

The Faculty of Medicine invites applications for a

Professorship (W2) of the History of Medicine and Pharmacy/Pharmaceutical Research in modern times

to be filled for winter term 2022/23.

This professorship is attached to the professorship (W3) of the History of Pharmacy and Medicine in the Faculty of Pharmacy. The successful candidate (f/m/d) is expected to represent the discipline in research and teaching, including philosophy of sciences. Therefore, the applicant should be well qualified in the field of the history of medicine and pharmacy and, ideally, of the natural sciences. One focus of research should be in the history of medicine or pharmacy in modern times.

Close collaboration with the professorship (W3) of the History of Pharmacy and Medicine in the interdepartmental Institute of pharmaceutical and medical history as well as with the colleagues in the faculties of Medicine and Pharmacy and the Humanities and Cultural Studies is expected.

The professorship is assigned to the scientific supervision of the Anatomical Collection (Museum Anatomicum) of the Faculty of Medicine and of the Emil von Behring Library.

Applicants should have a passion to teach and supervise students in the areas of medicine, dentistry and human biology as well as medicine and pharmacy and scientific education of both faculties. Furthermore, an engagement in the establishment of interprofessional teaching in medicine and pharmacy along with an interdisciplinary master study programme is anticipated.

The Universities of Gießen and Marburg have founded a research alliance with the Technical University Mittelhessen for Applied Sciences (the Research Campus Central Hessen) to practice a structured cooperation based on coordinated priorities. There is a further cooperation in teaching and research with the clinic of Fulda as well as Fulda High School. The successful applicant should signal readiness for collaboration with these institutions. Successful acquisition of peer-reviewed external funding is required.

The employment conditions of §§ 61, 62 HHG apply. The successful applicant needs to have completed his/her scientific university education of historical or cultural science, philosophy, medicine, pharmacy or any other subject referring to the professorship, and the doctorate and Habilitation or a similar scientific achievement in the context of the history of science or medicine should be demonstrated. Interdisciplinary and internationally visible research is desirable. Academic teaching experience in the field of history and theory of medicine should be renowned.

The Philipps University attaches great importance to the intensive supervision of students and doctoral candidates and expects from its lecturers and thus from the applicants a distinctive presence at the university, a high degree of commitment in the field of academic teaching and an intensive participation in the planned further development of medical education.

We support women and therefore explicitly encourage them to apply. We welcome individuals with children - the University of Marburg is committed to the goal of a family-friendly university. People with disabilities in the terms of the SGB IX (§ 2 Abs. 2, 3 SGB IX) are preferred if they are equally qualified for the position. Application and interview costs will not be reimbursed.
